SIBU: The Kejaman community in Belaga District has produced its first Kejaman-Bahasa Malaysia-English picture dictionary.

Kota Kinabalu Polytechnic lecturer Jacquelyne Ekot coauthored the dictionary with Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (Unimas) lecturer Amee Joan.

The main objective of publishing the dictionary is to preserve the Kejaman language. Not many Kejamans speak their native language now due to mix marriages.

Volume 1 consists of 57 pages with 260 selected Kejaman words divided into 10 sub-lists including body parts, home, agriculture, animals, crops, fruits, musical instruments and woven materials.

"For now, the dictionary is not for sale as it is still awaiting an ISBN (International Standard Book Number) serial number from Unimas," she said.

"Volume 2 of the dictionary will be out soon if everything goes smoothly.'
