A library as a place for art

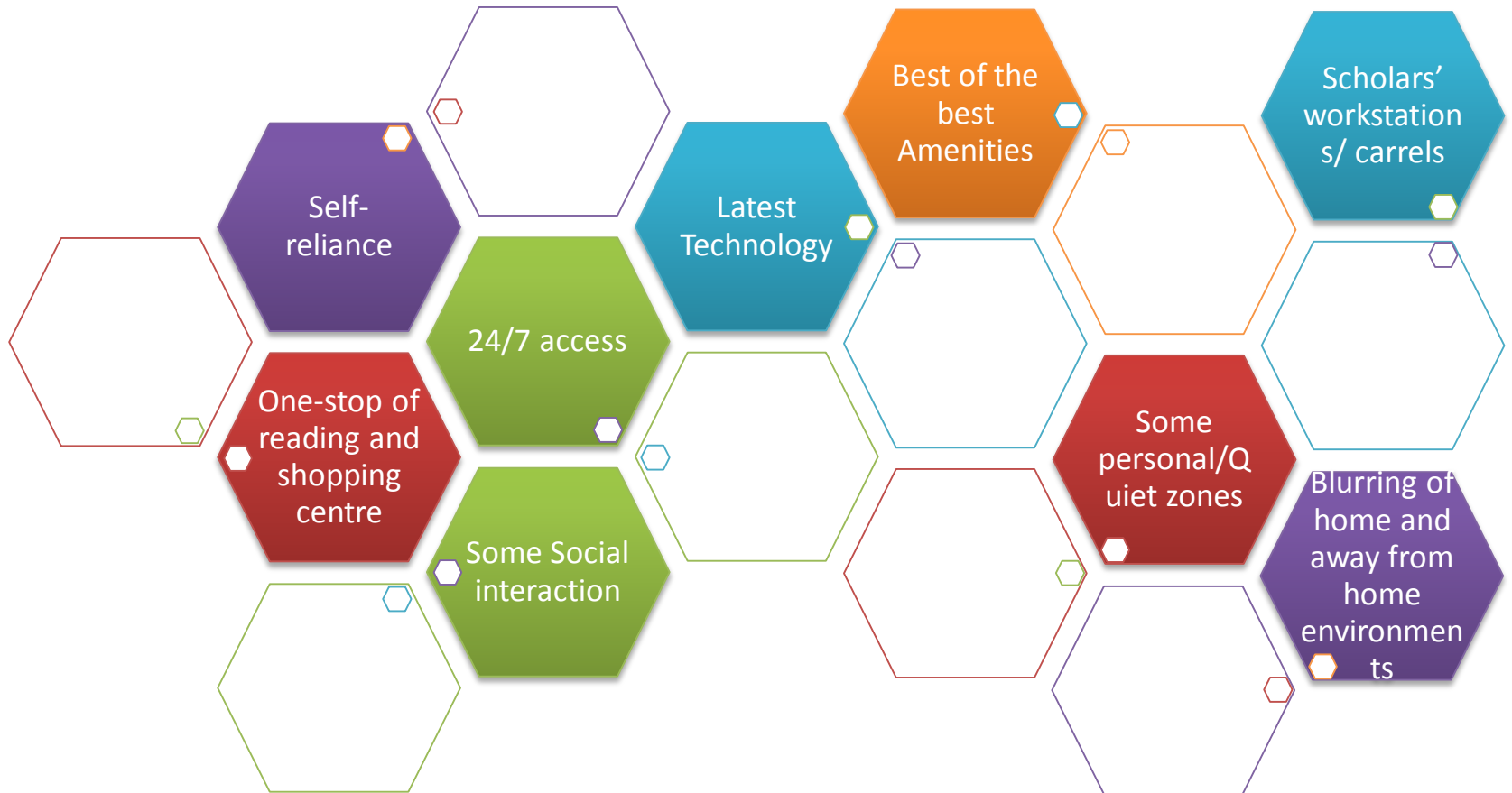

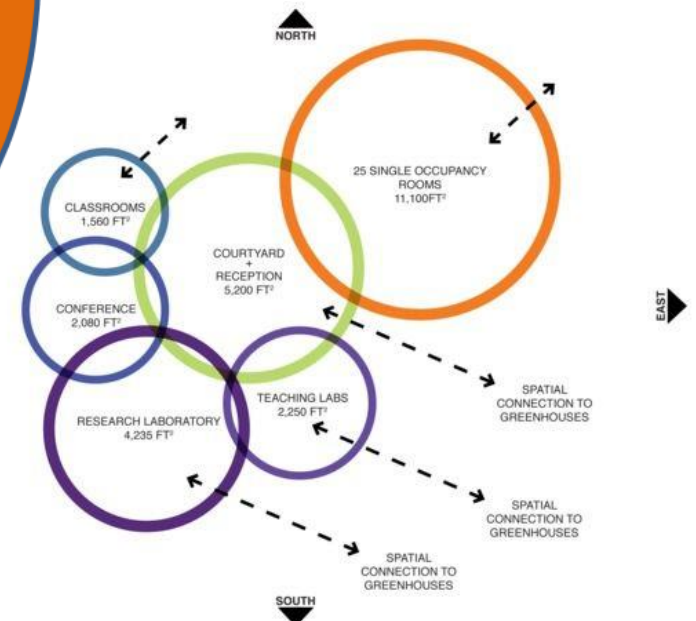
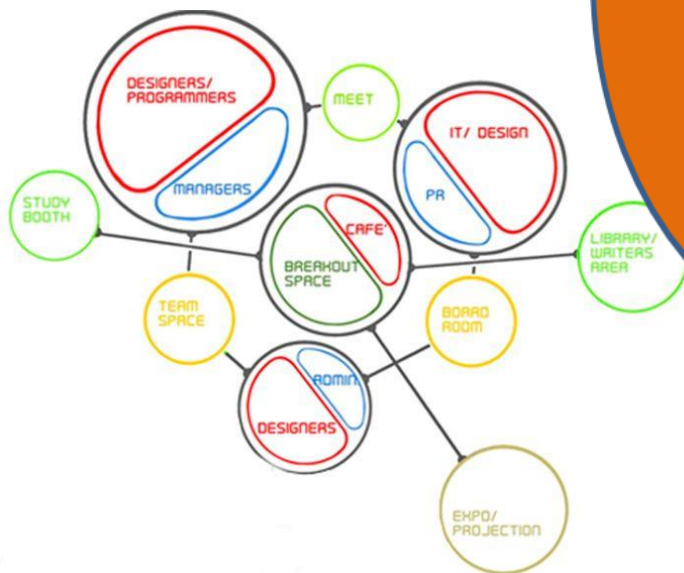
- Now you need to understand something about library.

- The point of storing (collection of books etc) items in your library is to give them a place, rather than having floating Avalon-items that disappear and reappear in different places within your library

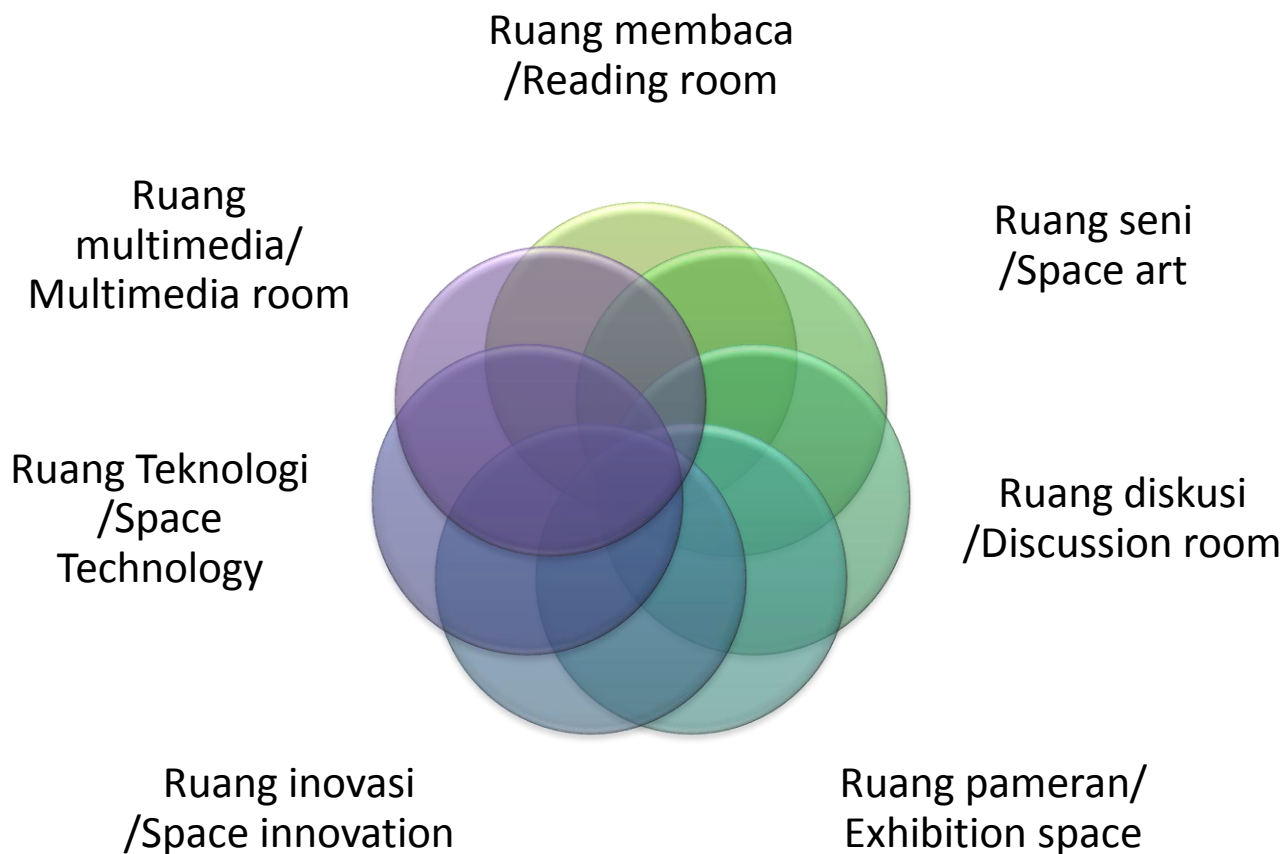
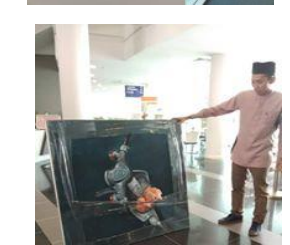
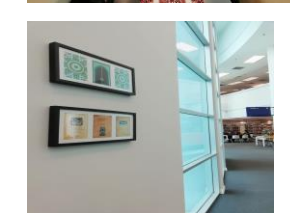

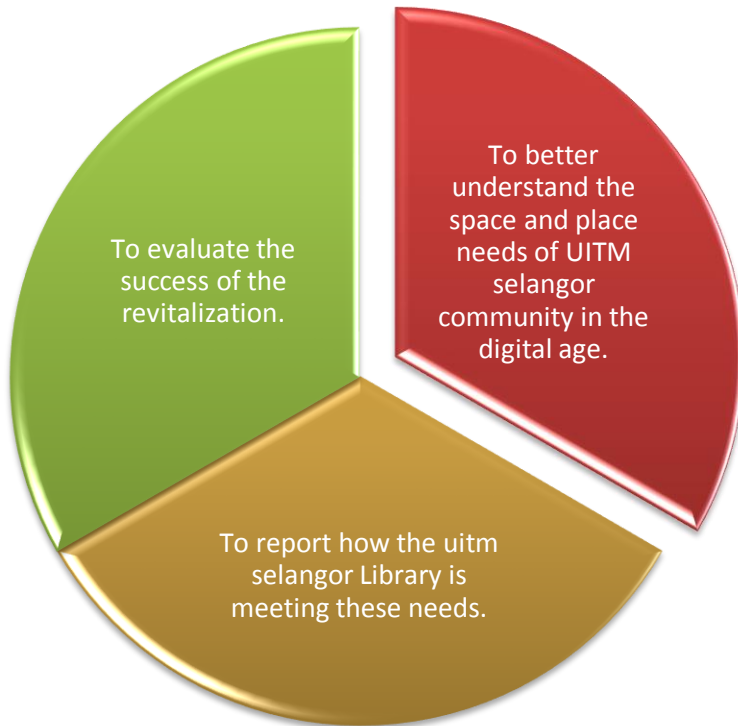
Librarians find themselves continuously asking how they can provide facilities that both foster learning and meet the changing needs of students and faculty?



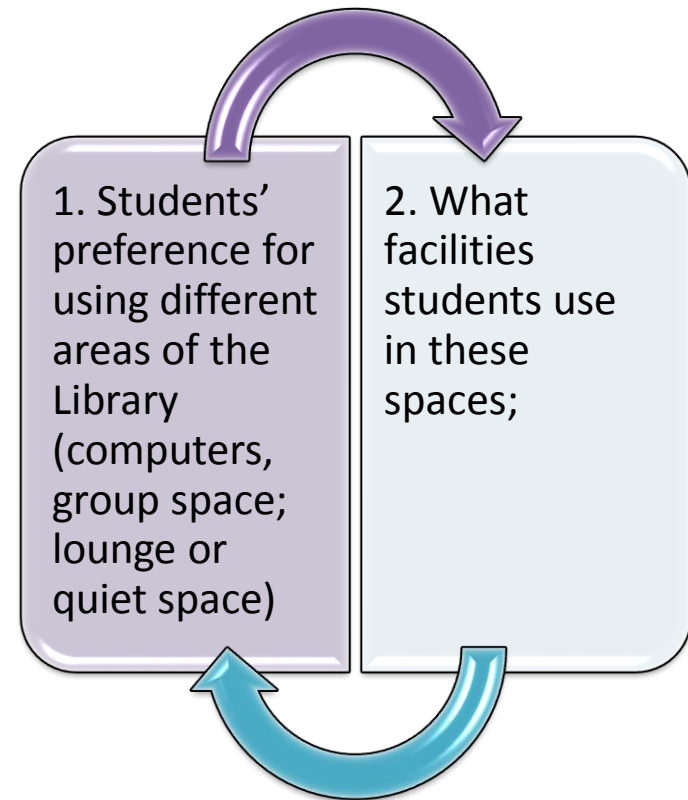

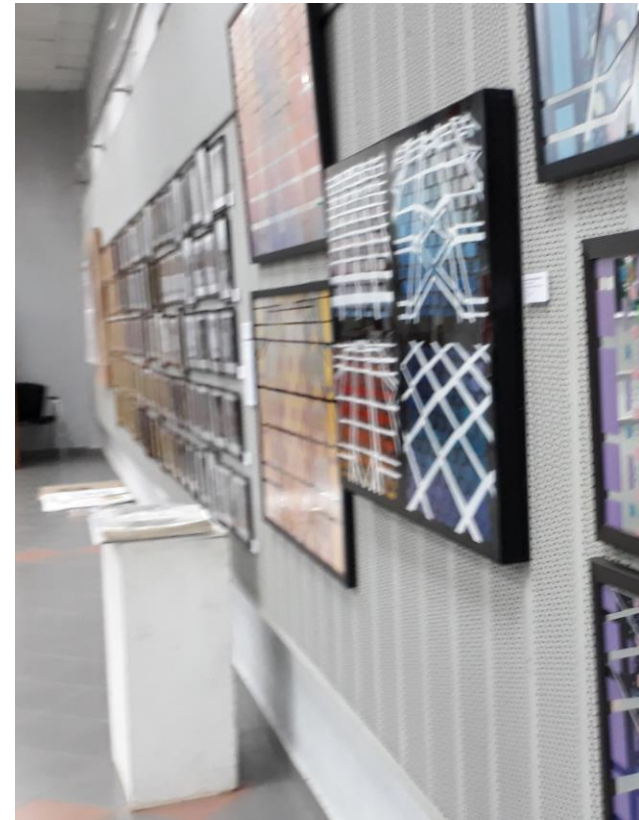

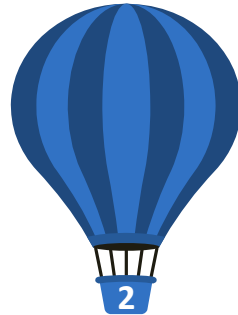


Libraries are places where people come to themselves and their communities.

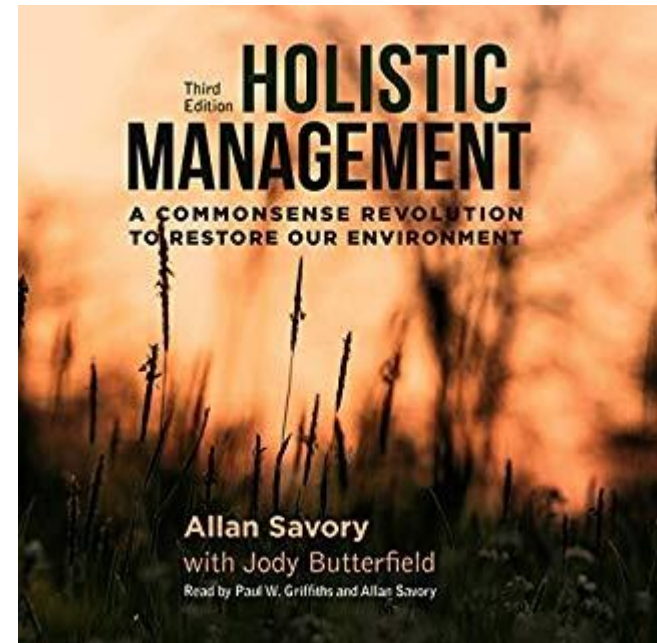
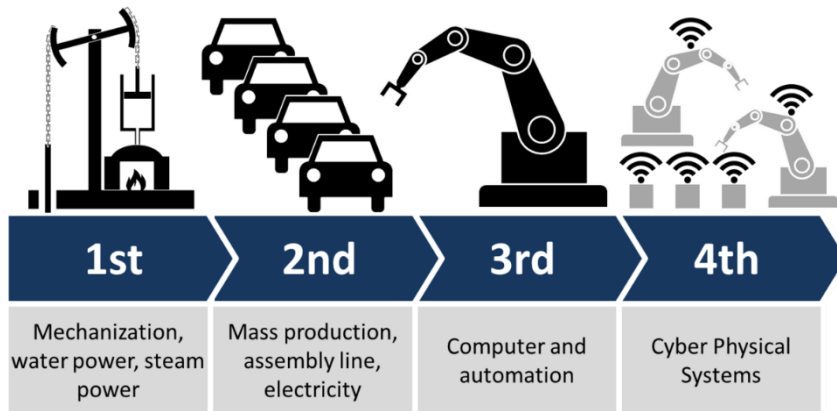
- Architectural attitudes to space (Saunders, 1983)
