New VC: Unimas to review strategic plans

Meanwhile, Khairuddin told reporters that there will always be room for improvement and new things to achieve for the university.

"We have to become the forefront in the education of new knowledge and innovation in the society. Therefore we have to challenge ourselves from time to time to achieve the new target in order to be competitive," he said, noting that in order for Unimas to be better known in the future.
