Do research on environ protection, Unimas lecturers and students told

KUCHING: Engineering lecturers and students at Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (Unimas) have been thrown the challenge to produce research papers on environmental protection in construction projects in line with escalating concerns about global warming.

Zecon Berhad's (formerly Zecon Engineering Berhad) executive director Abang Azahari Osman yesterday announced that the company would be giving out unlimited funding to both academicians and students who worked towards this end.

"It's part of our green project under our corporate social responsibility programme.
