UNIMAS to create longest 'kek lapis' in October

SAMARAHAN: Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (Unimas) hopes to enter the Malaysia Book of Records by making the longest 'kek lapis' this October.

Unimas Student Affairs and Alumni Division (HEPA) deputy vice chancellor Professor Mohd Fadzil Abdul Rahman said this would be the second effort by the university students, following the success of the 88-hour non-stop 'pantun' recital held in conjunction with the Unimas Convocation Fest last year.

"We have made plans to produce the longest 'kek lapis' in October in our bid to create another milestone in the Malaysia Book of Records," he said in his speech at the 'Hepa Bubur Lambuk Merdeka Ramadan' programme here yesterday.

In addition, Fadzil also revealed that Unimas is looking to include the preparation of 'bubur lambuk' into the Malaysia Book of Records in the near future.

"For next year's Ramadan, we are planning to hold a grand 'bubur lambuk' preparation activity involving the university's staff and students and maybe cook our way into the Malaysia Book of Records," he said.

In conjunction with the 'bubur lambuk' programme, Fadzil distributed some porridge to representatives of each faculty as well as members of the media at the university's student affairs centre.

Also present was student affairs centre chief Zuraidah Abas.
