Undergraduates from various universities, including Swinburne University of Technology, Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) and Universiti Tun Razak (Unitar) attended the event. During the event, Sagan presented a lengthy presentation on international trade and industrial policy. This was followed by a quiz session where those who attended were tested for their knowledge on the economic issues.
