KUCHING: Children from the Sarawak Children's Cancer Society (SCCS) and Kuching Children's Home are in for a treat at the inaugural Damai Ethnic Food Fest (DFF) 2013.

The two-day event, which kicks off this weekend at Damai Beach Resort, will feature over 40 stalls and booths selling local delicacies, along with clothes, souvenirs and handi-crafts.

"We are inviting 20 children each from SCCS and Kuching Children's Home to join us. Hopefully it will brighten up their day, as there will be lots of exciting activities for them besides enjoying all the food," said organising committee chairman Zulkifli Othman.

"I think it's a great way to show the children how much the society cares for them and the plight of the less fortunate," he said.

Zulkifli, who is also Damai Beach Resort's general manager, said there would also be a children's colouring contest as one of the events at the festival.

"We are calling on parents to enter their children for the contest as well as other activities specially organised for our young visitors. There will also be sing-along sessions and beach games."

According to Zulkifli, response to the sale of coupons for the event was encouraging so far.

Apart from the good food, drinks and games offered throughout the event, visitors will get to experience cultural dances courtesy of students from Universiti Malaysia Sarawak's Silat Seni Tari troupe, who will entertain audiences with a display of traditional Malay martial arts and dance moves.

There will even be a beach fishing competition for anglers to try their hand at landing a few big ones lurking in the sandy waters of the resort, with plenty of attractive cash prizes up for grabs.
