KOTA SAMARAHAN: Four high-performing students, the recipients of the Royal Education Award were among 1,200 who graduated at the 10th Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (Unimas) convocation yesterday.

Students Raudhah Ahmadi (Engineering Faculty) and Ong Kuo Ghee (Medicine and Health Science Faculty) received the Excellence Achievement Award while Raja Iskandar Raja Halid and Dahlia Tan Abdullah, both of whom were from the Applied and Creative Arts Faculty, received the Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor awards, respectively.

Two others, Linna Chieng Mee Ngiik and Diana Lim Siok Ley who were best students in the Science and Resource Technology were awarded the Sarawak Timber Association Award.

Meanwhile, Unimas' first batch of six Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) postgraduates also received their scrolls at the university's 10th convocation yesterday.

On hand to present the graduates their awards and scrolls was Head of State Tun Datuk Patinggi Abang Muhammad Salahuddin. Salahuddin hoped that the graduates would strive to become "ambassadors
